Carly Ryan was 15-years-old when she was murdered by an online predator. It was the first crime of its type in Australia, occurring in 2007 when social media was a new phenomenon and paedophiles were starting to infiltrate the online space. Determined to help prevent harm to other innocent children and families and to help them navigate their online journey safely, Carly's mum Sonya incorporated The Carly Ryan Foundation in 2010.

Our children are using the internet daily to connect with each other and the world around them. It is important to empower students to make wise choices, to look after their digital reputation and keep themselves and others safe while navigating the internet, apps and forming their own relationships both online and offline.


The Carly Ryan Foundation with support from The Department of Social Services and the Government of South Australia is offering workshops in each state of Australia. These detailed seminars will be offered to Year's 5 to Year 12 school students. We will also provide seminars for parents and the community.

Our sessions provide connection and positive outcomes throughout each state we visit. The Carly Ryan Foundation is a certified online safety program provider under the Office of the eSafety Commissioner's certification scheme.

The harm-prevention charity is based in Carly's home state of South Australia but presents its education program *'Project Connect'* nationally. The team will deliver the seminars throughout the year while balancing its political advocacy work which has already seen *'Carly's Law'* introduced into the Commonwealth Criminal Code last year and in SA this year.

Online Safety Presenters

The online safety sessions will be delivered by trained presenters.

The Carly Ryan Foundation's approach is about building on the emotional intelligence of young people, enabling them to make better choices, have respect for others, build resilience and enable positive communication.

The Foundation visits schools nationally, where the team educates about the benefits of connecting online as well as the potential risks inherent through internet interaction.

- UAE Fatima bint Mubarak Mother of the Nation Award 2018


Sonya is a member of the Online Safety Consultative Working Group with eSafety Commissioner, Julie Inman Grant. The Working Group was established to provide advice to the Federal Government on cyber safety issues. In addition, Sonya is a member of the eSafety and Mental Health Steering Group bringing together leading mental health and eSafety bodies including The Carly Ryan Foundation.

This group is developing a consistent messaging and research framework as well as an incident response plan to ensure that the media, the government and relevant individuals have rapid access to best practice and evidence-based guidance.

Healthy Relationships

These sessions will be delivered to students from year 8 to year 12 only.


